Workshop goals & topics

Basic financial literacy skills and a comprehensive understanding of their financial responsibilities (as they relate to governance, budgeting, reporting, planning, trust funds) are necessary for this important work. This 1-day workshop is designed to help Chief and Council with their understanding of complex financial issues and gain knowledge, skills and confidence to make informed decisions. Participants will learn:

- Reporting Requirements
- Corporate Responsibility with a FN Development Corporation
- Understanding not-for profit entities and business entities
- How FN communities can use these as mechanisms to meet their economic development needs
